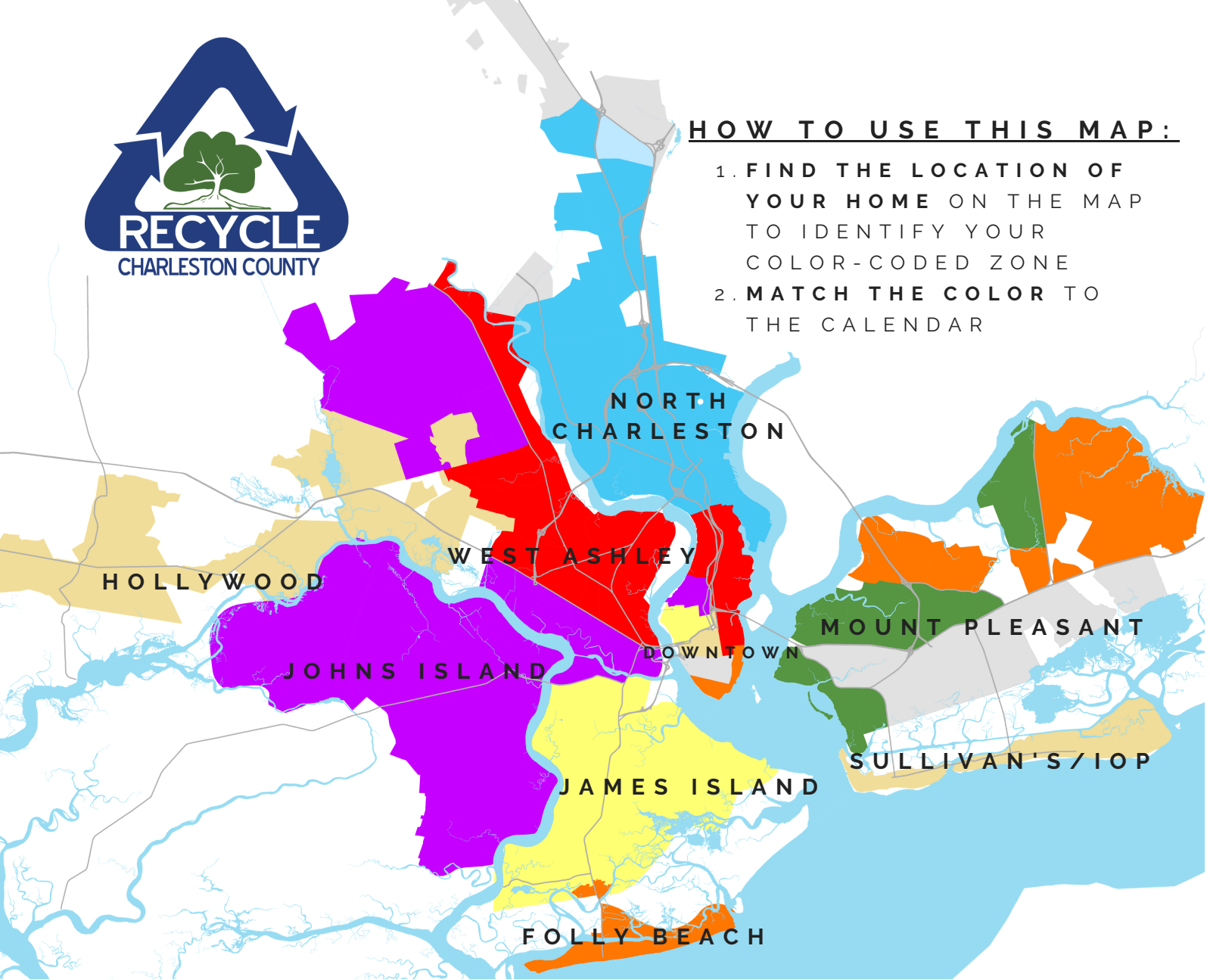




HOW TO USE THIS MAP:

- **HANDLES** FACING HOUSE
- **HAVE CART OUT BY 7AM** ON YOUR BI-WEEKLY COLLECTION DAY
- **NO PLASTIC BAGS**

NO SCRAP METAL

TAKE MIXED METALS TO YOUR LOCAL CONVENIENCE CENTER.



NO CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS

LEAVE OUT BUILDING MATERIALS LIKE INSULATION, WOOD, AND CONCRETE.



NO TEXTILES

DONATE CLOTHING AND TEXTILES TO A LOCAL CHARITY OR THRIFT STORE.



NO HAZARDOUS OR MEDICAL WASTE
