ORIGINATING OFFICE PLEASE NOTE:

Through the U.S. Department of Homeland Security grant funding, the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) has awarded funds in the amount of \$65,000 to Charleston County for the purpose of upgrading current hazardous materials equipment for the Low Country Regional Weapons of Mass Destruction-Hazardous Materials Response Team – Charleston to assist the team in meeting the required FEMA Standard; thus enhancing the County's inventory of response capabilities.

Matching funds on behalf of Charleston County are not required. There are no FTE's, reoccurring cost, or vehicles associated with the acceptance of this funding. The grant period is September 1, 2016 to August 31, 2017.

ACTION REQUESTED OF COUNCIL

Approve acceptance of grant award, in the amount of \$65,000, through the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Grant Program.

DEPARTMENT HEAD RECOMMENDATION

- Approve the Emergency Management Department's request to receive grant funding in the amount of \$65,000 through the 2016 U.S. Department of Homeland Security Grant Program, allowing for the upgrade and sustainment of the Low Country Regional Weapons of Mass Destruction-Hazardous Materials Response Team's current inventory.
- Matching funds on behalf of Charleston County are not required.
- There are no FTE's, vehicles, or reoccurring costs associated with the acceptance of the above referenced grant program.
- The grant performance period is September 1, 2016 to August 31, 2017.

ORIGINATING OFFICE PLEASE NOTE:

The Center Street Paving and Restriping Project (TST) is located on Folly Beach. This project consists of resurfacing Center Street at Folly Beach and restriping the road to include two parking lanes, two travel lanes and a two way left turn lane. The work shall include traffic control, milling, surface preparation, asphalt resurfacing, pavement markings, concrete construction, and associated appurtenances of Center Street at Folly Beach.

Bids were received in accordance with the terms and conditions of Invitation for Bid No. 5083-17C. The mandatory Small Business Enterprise (SBE) requirement for this solicitation is 12.2% and the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal is 25%.

The Center Street Paving and Restriping Project (TST) was requested by the City of Folly Beach and is being funded by the Transportation Sales Tax FY 2017 Local Road Paving Allocation and the FY 2017 Resurfacing Allocation. The City of Folly Beach completed the design and permitting and is providing up to \$90,000 to complete the construction of the project.

ORIGINATING OFFICE PLEASE NOTE:

On July 14, 2016, County Council authorized staff to negotiate with Mashburn Construction Company, Inc., to provide design/build services for the Materials Recovery Facility (MRF).

Council's Directive states the final contract will be brought back to Council for approval. The design/build contract with Mashburn will have two parts. The first part involves design of the MRF and associated costs. A contract has been negotiated for the first part in the amount of \$1,311,534.00 for pre-construction, design, and design/build management services.

The second part will take place in 3-5 months when the Design Development Documents are completed and approved by staff. At that time, the County and Mashburn will negotiate a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) for the project, which will be brought before Council for final approval.

Authorize the award of contract.
