#### **ORIGINATING OFFICE PLEASE NOTE:**

The Charleston Center is requesting permission to accept a sub grant from the South Carolina Department of Alcohol and other Drug Abuse Services (DAODAS) in the amount of \$286,154 for the support of the Screening, Brief Interventions, and Referrals to Treatment (SBIRT) project. The SBIRT project will be used as a collaborative agreement and effort involving the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC) and the Charleston Center, (SBIRT) to develop coordination of care by placing Patient Navigators in the MUSC Emergency Room and the MUSC Ashley River Tower. The Patient Navigators will be assisting with gathering PHI and database input, treatment referrals to Charleston Center and patient follow-up once persons are identified by MUSC staff. Charleston Center has identified 4 internal PCNs that can be allocated for the positions. We will reallocate PCN 4650000143 and PCN 4650000149 for the 2 FTE positions and PCN 4650000152 and PCN 4650000164 for the 2 temporary positions. These are grant funded positions that will end once the grant ends.

Once the funds have been accepted, the budget management and monthly reporting become the responsibility of the Charleston Center.

# ACTION REQUESTED OF COUNCIL

Authorize the acceptance of the sub grant for \$286,154 from State DAODAS.

- Authorize the acceptance of the original award in the amount of \$274,154 from State DAODAS to provide salaries, fringe benefits and operational expenses for 2 new Clinical Counselors I Regular positions (salary and fringe) and 2 Clinical Counselors Temporary positions to assist in identifying and providing services for those individuals with substance use disorders. An additional \$12,000 is being added to budget for non-cash incentives. Total award of the grant is \$286,154.
- Once the funds have been accepted, the budget management and the monthly reporting become the responsibility of the Charleston Center.
- There are 2 FTEs positions and 2 Temporary positions associated with this award.
- The award period is August 1, 2016 July 31, 2017.

#### **ORIGINATING OFFICE PLEASE NOTE:**

In 2015, the Economic Development Director worked with officials from Mercedes-Benz Vans LLC and the SC Commerce Department to facilitate the establishment of their full van production facility for the NAFTA territory. The company will spend \$500 million to complete its campus and will hire 1,300 persons during a five-year period.

As part of the financial incentives package, the SCANA Corporation pledged \$2 Million in Economic Development Grant funding for site improvements related to the expansion of the Mercedes-Benz Vans facility. The SCANA funding was timed to be released after the electrical provider consummated an electrical service contract with the company for the new expansion. This contract execution occurred recently.

This grant will be managed by the Economic Development Department. Financial closeout and audits will be conducted by the County's financial team in the usual manner.

The Highway 61 Sidewalk Phase 3 project is located in the West Ashley area of Charleston County. This project will consist of installing concrete sidewalk along the northeast side of SC 61/Ashley River Road from Magwood Road to Parsonage Road. Phases 1 and 2 of the project have been completed along SC 61 from Tobias Gadson Boulevard to Magwood Road. The work shall include, but is not limited to, clearing, site excavation, sub-grade preparation, grading, concrete sidewalk installation, storm drainage installation, erosion and sedimentation control, traffic control, roadway signing, pavement striping, and associated appurtenances. The project will be constructed utilizing the items listed on the bid form in the solicitation.

#### ORIGINATING OFFICE PLEASE NOTE:

The TST FY15/Town of Mount Pleasant (TOMP) FY16 Resurfacing project shall include traffic control, milling, surface preparation, asphalt resurfacing, striping and associated appurtenances of various paved roadways within the boundaries of Charleston County and the Town of Mount Pleasant. The approximate total project length is 20 miles.

The City of North Charleston requested the County resurface seven (7) roads within the City and pledged to provide \$500,000 to complete the work. The roads were evaluated by the County and were determined to be in need of resurfacing and therefore an IGA was executed for the City and the County to provide matching funds to complete the work. The total estimated cost to complete this work is \$1,080,000.

The TOMP FY16 project is part of an annual pavement management program that the County has agreed to administer for the Town. This allows us to get better pricing due to economy of scale and the County has the experienced staff to inspect the work. The Town selects the roads to be paved and provides 100% of the funds to complete the work. The bid amount for the TOMP FY16 project is \$2,027,354.50 and any overruns or additions to the project will be funded by the Town.

This project includes roadway and drainage improvements along Maybank SC Highway 700 from its intersection at River Road S-54 to Paul J. Gelegotis Bridge over the Stono River on Johns Island. Specific work items involved in the execution of the project include, but are not limited to, traffic control, earthwork, asphalt paving, sub-grade preparation, storm drainage improvements, pavement marking and roadway signing, traffic signal work, the installation of the concrete curb and gutter, and concrete sidewalks.

The purpose of the project is to alleviate the afternoon congestion on the Paul J. Gelegotis Bridge caused by the merging of the two travel lanes into one travel lane onto Johns Island. The improvements will widen Maybank Highway, to include the continuation of the lane from the bridge over the Stono River to the existing right turn lane at the intersection of River Road, and provide bicycle and pedestrian accommodations.

#### **ORIGINATING OFFICE PLEASE NOTE:**

The right of way acquisition process is the most unpredictable portion of a Transportation Sales Tax Project schedule. A negotiated purchase of right of way depends on the willingness of affected property owners to reach a mutually agreeable settlement. Therefore, the entire schedule can be negatively impacted when the attempted acquisition of one or more individual properties cannot be resolved through reasonable negotiations.

In order to move forward with construction of all phases of the Maybank Highway Improvements Project, staff requests that Council approve the use of eminent domain. It is intended that the actual condemnation actions would be filed only in cases where it appears that a settlement is not imminent.

Staff remains extremely sensitive to the rights of the property owners affected by this project, and has directed that the right of way consultants continue to exercise all due care when negotiating with the owners. It is staff's intent to continue coordination with the property owners during the condemnation process in an effort to reach settlements out of court.

# A RESOLUTION

# AUTHORIZING THE EXERCISE OF EMINENT DOMAIN TO ACQUIRE TITLE TO OR INTERESTS IN REAL PROPERTY FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING ROAD IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE MAYBANK HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

SECTION I. FINDINGS

THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CHARLESTON COUNTY, IN MEETING DULY ASSEMBLED, HEREBY FINDS AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, as a project being undertaken as part of its Transportation Sales Tax Program, Charleston County intends to construct certain improvements to Maybank Highway and River Road on Johns Island in Charleston County, SC (the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the plans for the improvements are shown on the technical drawings entitled "Construction Plans" (the "Plans"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Plans depict, *inter alia*, the existing roadway, the proposed roadway and the privately-owned properties and portions of properties that the County seeks to acquire to complete the Project; and

WHEREAS, said Plans are subject to refinement and revision as additional design efforts and investigations are undertaken regarding the roadway alignment and the Project's components, including but not limited to sidewalks, utilities, drainage facilities and the traveling surface; and

WHEREAS, the acquisition of the privately-owned properties will be accomplished in accordance with the eminent domain laws of the State of South Carolina; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the citizens of Charleston County to acquire title to or an interest in the privately-owned properties in order to complete the Project; and

**W**HEREAS, public purposes, health, welfare, and safety, including, but not limited to, the facilitation of commerce and the convenience of the traveling public will be served by acquiring the properties and completing the Project; and

**WHEREAS**, the properties acquired will be for a public use, including but not limited to, the improvement of a publicly-owned thoroughfare in Charleston County.

#### **SECTION II. ACTIONS AUTHORIZED**

As a result of the findings set forth above, and by virtue of the powers granted to the County under the constitution and statutes of the State of South Carolina, the Charleston County Council hereby authorizes and directs the following:

Charleston County Council hereby authorizes the exercise of eminent domain to acquire full title or a property interest in the privately-owned property as shown on the abovedescribed Plans, as the same may be refined or revised from time to time, for the Project. Council expressly authorizes the acquisition of the parcels identified on the above-described Plans, in whole or in part, as the needs of the Project so require.

Per the terms of the RFQ, it is the intent of Charleston County to identify three (3) civil engineering firms which will be considered for award for each special project during the course of the year. The County will always negotiate with the firm identified as the most qualified first. If a fair and reasonable cost and time frame can be successfully negotiated, that firm will be awarded the Contract. If however, successful negotiations with this firm are not concluded, the County will attempt to negotiate with the firm identified as the second most qualified firm. Failure to reach successful negotiations with this firm will result in the County attempting to conduct negotiations with the firm identified as being the third most qualified firm. If negotiations fail with these three firms, a solicitation for the specific project will be opened for all vendors to participate in the RFQ process.
