Public Involvement Planned for Major Transportation “Half-Cent” Sales Tax Project
Public information meeting to be held on Wednesday, Sept. 26, for a bond referendum project: Maybank Highway widening

Charleston County RoadWise announces a public information meeting regarding proposed improvements to Maybank Highway, which will be funded by the Transportation “Half-Cent” Sales Tax.

A public information meeting on the Maybank Highway widening project will be held on Wednesday, Sept. 26, from 6-8 p.m. at the Berkeley Electric Cooperative Community Center (3351 Maybank Highway, Johns Island, South Carolina, 29455).

The purpose of the meeting is for project staff to provide information and receive public comments on proposed plans to widen Maybank Highway between the Stono River Bridge and Main Road. The proposed plans include widening this section from a two-lane roadway to a multi-lane roadway with sidewalks for pedestrians and a paved multi-use path for bicyclists.

Those attending the meeting will have the opportunity to review conceptual drawings, proposed project renderings, and submit their comments.

The proposed Maybank Highway widening project was made possible as a result of the passage of the November 2006 Transportation Sales Tax bond referendum.

Public input is an essential part of the Charleston County RoadWise program. During these meetings, the public is given an opportunity to gather information that may affect them and submit their comments.

Charleston County RoadWise is Charleston County Government’s management program for the construction of roads, highways, resurfacing, paving and drainage projects funded by the Transportation Sales Tax.
