## Traffic Alert: Lane Closures on East Frontage and Johnnie Dodds

*Note speed limit reductions on Johnnie Dodds Boulevard during construction*

[Charleston County Government](#) announces extensions on road work as part of the [Johnnie Dodds Boulevard Improvements Project](#) in Mount Pleasant that will affect East Frontage Road and Johnnie Dodds Boulevard (U.S. 17).

### **EXTENDED: Daytime lane closures on East Frontage Road for one month:**

- Drivers should expect a lane closure on East Frontage Road between New Market Centre and south of Crickentree Apartments beginning on Wednesday, March 30 between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. and continuing for one month.
- Vehicles may access businesses that are located along East Frontage Road from either Bowman Road or Anna Knapp Boulevard.
- One lane of traffic will be left open while crews work on East Frontage Road.
- The work is necessary for crews to install new storm drainage pipes.
- If the weather is poor any day during the month, the closures will continue until the work is completed.

### **EXTENDED: April 4-15 Lane closures on Johnnie Dodds Boulevard:**

- As part of the [Johnnie Dodds Boulevard Improvements Project](#) in Mount Pleasant, road crews will temporarily close lanes on Johnnie Dodds Boulevard near Stuckey Furniture.
- The construction activity will occur 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. April 4-15.
- The work is being conducted at night in an effort to reduce impact on drivers.
- The speed limit on Johnnie Dodds Boulevard will be reduced from 45 mph to 35 mph. in the construction zone when crews are working. Temporary signs will alert the public of the speed limit reduction.
- The work is necessary for crews to install underground drainage pipes.
- If the weather is poor any day during April 4-15, the closures will continue until the work is completed.

### **Background information on the project:**

- The goal of the project, which is expected to be completed in the fall of 2012, is to improve the traffic flow in and out of Mount Pleasant, especially before and after school and work hours.
- The project is funded by the [Charleston County Transportation Sales Tax](#) and managed by [Charleston County Government's](#) RoadWise Program, in close coordination with the [Town of Mount Pleasant](#) and the [S.C. Department of Transportation](#).
- Drivers traveling through the project area are asked to be aware of equipment and crews working in the area. Alternative routes are recommended if possible. The public is also asked to notice traffic control signs, reductions in speed limit and message board information, and to note that all road work is dependent on the weather. Every effort is being made to schedule necessary lane closures for the project during off-peak, nighttime and weekend hours when possible.
