Earth Day volunteers can choose from two half-day shifts or a full-day commitment. Time frames for the morning, afternoon, and full-day shifts are as follows:

- Morning: 8 a.m. 12 p.m. (event set-up and festival opening)
- Afternoon: 12 p.m. 5 p.m. (working the festival and break-down at the end of the day)
- Full-day: 8 a.m. 5 p.m. (lunch is provided for volunteers of the full-day shift)

All volunteers will receive an event T-shirt, which features the winner of the Earth Day Art Contest.

Duties will include:

- Helping vendors and exhibitors set up and breakdown at their designated table/tent.
- Assisting with making crafts and hands-on science activities.
- Staffing the welcome table to greet and direct guests.
- Assisting with entertainment and education providers.

Earth Day was established as a national holiday in 1970 and is now celebrated by over a half-billion people around the world.
