Charleston County Hosts 16th Annual Earth Day Festival on April 18

11 a.m. - 4 p.m. at Riverfront Park in North Charleston

<u>Charleston County's Environmental Management Department</u> invites citizens to join in celebrating Earth Day during the <u>2015 Earth Day Festival</u> on Saturday, April 26. The free event will be held from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m. at Riverfront Park on the former Naval Base in North Charleston.

The 16th Annual Earth Day Festival is a celebration of Charleston County's environmental community. The festival provides hands-on educational opportunities for all ages and highlights the County's environmental programs.

"Charleston County's Annual Earth Day Festival is a great opportunity for citizens to learn how to protect our local environment by conserving our resources," said Councilmember Colleen Condon. "We invite Lowcountry residents to join us for this admission-free, fun and family oriented environmental event at North Charleston's beautiful Riverfront Park."

Charleston County's Earth Day Festival attracts as many as 8,000 people each year. All participants are asked to commit to reducing waste at the event. Resource Recovery Centers will be strategically located throughout the park to collect recyclable materials and organic waste generated during the festival.

<u>Charleston County's Annual Earth Day Art Contest</u> was held again this year and students in grades kindergarten through sixth grade submitted drawings for the theme: "Protect Our Planet. Conserve Resources" The winning artwork will be featured at the event and will be printed on the back of all festival T-shirts.
