## Charleston County Observes April as National 9-1-1 Education Month; Targets Pocket Dialing

April is National 9-1-1 Education Month and <u>Charleston County Government</u> is calling on local leaders, schools and public safety agencies to help educate our citizens about the importance and appropriate use of 9-1-1 services.

This year, Charleston County will place an emphasis on educating the public on how to avoid un-intentional 9-1-1 calls. Cell phones are the primary source for 9-1-1 calls and if the phone isn't properly locked, citizens may unknowingly call 9-1-1. It's a situation commonly referred to as pocket dialing. During this year's National 9-1-1 Education Month, we are reminding citizens to Lock it before you Pocket It.

"Our 9-1-1 public educators continue to do an amazing job in raising the awareness of how 9-1-1 works," said Consolidated Dispatch Director Jim Lake. "This year's focus on pocket dials will help reduce the number of unintentional calls received in our 9-1-1 Center so that we are available to answer the true emergency calls that come in."
