Public Comment Period on Charleston County Council Redistricting Maps

Charleston County Council has released three map options for redistricting following the release of 2020 Census data. The new map options are available on the County's website at www.charlestoncounty.org and digitally at all Charleston County Public Library branches. Public comments are encouraged and can be emailed to redistricting@charlestoncounty.org.

The primary goal of redistricting is to abide by the Constitutional principle of "one person, one vote," and equalize the total population in each district as much as possible and in accordance with state and federal law. Demographic data is included on a table on each map option.

The following table shows the "Benchmark" data which is the 2020 Census data applied to currently drawn districts:

Charleston County's total population increased by 58,026 from 2010 to 2020, but the number of Black residents significantly declined. The populations identified by the Census as White or Hispanic both increased significantly.

Council is scheduled to hold first reading of the redistricting ordinance on January 13, with a public hearing and second reading scheduled for January 18. Third reading is scheduled for February 1.
