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Charleston County's Consolidated Dispatch Center Reaccredited

The Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials' (APCO) has reaccredited Charleston County's Consolidated Dispatch Center (CDC) through their P33 Training Program. This is the departments second reaccreditation for APCO P33. Charleston County was one of 32 agencies nationwide that met the requirements for this certification in 2022.
