RE: Green Ribbon Committee - Request to Approve

At a regular meeting of County Council held on August 19, 2008, Council agreed to appoint a 15 Member Committee composed of Charleston County residents, as follows:

1. One of the members shall be qualified by experience or training in the field of Energy Management, preferably certified by the Association of Energy Engineers as a Certified Energy Manager or shall be qualified by experience or training in the field of renewable energy systems.
2. One of the members shall be qualified by experience or training in the field of transportation of solid waste.
3. One of the members shall be qualified by experience or training in the field of solid waste management.
4. One of the members shall be qualified by experience or training in the field of recycling.
5. One of the members shall be qualified by experience or training in the field of real estate development.
6. One of the members shall be qualified by experience or training in the environmental sciences.
7. One of the members shall be qualified by being a resident in the Bees Ferry corridor.
8. One of the members shall be qualified by being a resident living within one half of a mile of the current incinerator.
9. One municipal representative from each of the three largest municipalities: the City of Charleston, the City of North Charleston and the Town of Mount Pleasant.
10. One municipal representative from a small municipality East of the Cooper River, and one from small municipality West of the Ashley River.
11. Two members shall be at-large representatives of the community.

That the Duties of the Charleston County Green Ribbon Committees are:

1. to convene for a period of one year.
2. to review and evaluate existing county and municipal environmental policies, practices, and procedures.
3. to serve as a board of advisors to the consulting firm charged with drafting the Charleston County Green for Green Plan, which plan will focus on sustainability addressing the areas of solid waste management and energy use, and analyzing the cost-effective nature.
4. to gather input from the public regarding the Charleston County Green for Green Plan.
5. to act as a municipal and county liaison for shared environmental and sustainability concerns between the municipalities and the County.
6. to act as an advocate for sustainability.
7. to work with the consulting firm in the drafting of the Charleston County Green for Green Plan.
