This April marks the one-year anniversary of my appointment to Executive Director. Over the past 12 months, I have led the election staff in developing policies and programming that both ensure the security, efficiency, and integrity of the voting process and improve access among all registered voters. In the coming year, I intend to maintain that trajectory to provide the voters of Charleston County with services that are continually improving and innovative.

# **NEW INITIATIVES**

### **ADOPT A POLLING PLACE**

Adopt a Polling Place is a new Charleston County Board of Elections initiative where non-profit organizations can partner with us to "adopt" a polling location. An organization or business provides staff for one (or multiple) of our polling locations. Rather than paying each volunteer individually, we will write a single check to the organization. The organization can use the funds toward projects and programs that further their mission.

Our voters benefit from professional poll managers and improved services while organizations benefit from additional funds, team building, and goodwill. In similar programs, the money earned from supporting polling locations has been used to fund scholarships, food bank donations, and outreach projects.

This program has seen great success in states across the nation and we are excited to pilot it in Charleston County.

### **INCREASED POLL WORKER PAY**

We are excited to announce that compensation for our poll workers has increased by \$65. Poll workers will now receive \$200, and clerks will jump from \$195 to \$260. The pay increase allows us to show our appreciation to our poll workers for their hard work and dedication.

Serving as a poll worker gives you the opportunity to get out in your community, meet your neighbors, and become involved in the elections process.


## REDISTRICTING UPDATE

The South Carolina State Legislature has finalized the new representative districts for South Carolina and Charleston County voters have been affected by the recent changes. All registered voters within Charleston County will receive a postcard detailing their districts.

Any change made is also visible in your voter profile on <u>scvotes.gov</u>. You can use your voter profile to see your district, polling location and ensure that your address is up to date in the voter registration system.

Make sure to check your voter profile in advance of the June primaries. We want everyone to be #voteready!

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

South Carolina is among the 19 states in the US that do not register by party. Voters can vote in any party's primary regardless of their party affiliation but cannot vote in more than one party's primary.







## JUNE PRIMARIES

The June primary will be held on June 14th, 2022. A majority vote determines the winners in primary elections. If no clear candidate wins a majority vote, a runoff election will be held two weeks later, on June 28th, 2022.

In-person absentee voting will begin on May 16th at our office located at 4367 Headquarters Road, North Charleston, South Carolina 29405.

We will also provide in-person absentee voting opportunities at Charleston County Library branches through our Satellite Voting Unit (SVU).

To be eligible to vote in the primary election, you must register online at <u>scvotes.gov</u> by May 15th or register via mail with an application postmarked no later than May 16th.
