- Fire Protection Preparation:**
- ❖ Install smoke detectors near all sleeping areas. Test detectors regularly for proper functioning.
  - ❖ Call 911 at the first sign of fire.
  - ❖ Practice family fire drills and designate meeting places outside your home if it should catch fire.
  - ❖ Have a multi-purpose fire extinguisher available in the kitchen, garage, and wherever a fire potential exists in your home.
  - ❖ Identify rooms where children or pets may be located with “Tot Finder” or “Pet Finder” stickers
  - ❖ Store flammable substances in proper containers and locations
