ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Charleston County and the City of North Charleston partner to manage U.S. Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funds. The purpose of this funding is to provide clean, suitable and decent living conditions for the area's low-to-moderate income population.

Clean Water

Forty households were provided access to clean water &/or sanitary waste water systems.



Affordable Housing Construction

The Town of Hollywood, in partnership with the County, created four affordable housing units.



At-Risk Youth

Treatment and counseling was provided to 219 neglected and/or abused children

Home Rehabilitation

Community partners repaired and rehabilitated 24 substandard houses.

Education & Training

Training, counseling and classes provided by 11 agencies assisted 1,830 people.



Rapid Re-housing & Shelter Services

Funding provided to two agencies who were able to assist 611 people with either shelter placement or rapid re-housing.
