#### SITUATION

The South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) in accordance with Section 34.8 of the part IB Provisos of the 2017-2018 Appropriations Act will distribute state appropriated funds for the purpose of improving and upgrading the EMS system. Charleston County's allocation for Fiscal Year 2016 – 2017, based upon the proportion of the population, is \$26,136.30.

The funds will be used to purchase a computer enhanced training manikin, with full accessories, which is allowed as specialized equipment to support approved training programs.

#### **ACTION REQUESTED OF COUNCIL**

Authorize EMS to apply for and accept the state appropriated funding at the allocated amount for \$26,136.30

#### DEPARTMENT HEAD RECOMMENDATION

- Allow EMS to apply for and accept if awarded the state appropriated funding from SC DHEC EMS Grant in Aid Program for \$26,136.30 to purchase a computer enhanced training manikin, with full accessories, to support approved training programs.
- Once the funds have been accepted, the budget management and reporting become the responsibility of the EMS Department.
- No FTE's associated with this award.
- The 5.5% matching funds are available.
- Grant period is from July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018.

# Financial Update

March 8, 2018

# FY18 Mid-year Réview

- General Fund Revenues
  - Overall: \$0.8M above budget
    - Property taxes higher
    - Sales tax lower
    - Local Government Fund from State for retirement lower
    - Federal prisoner revenues higher

# FY18 Mid-year Réview

- General Fund Expenditures
  - Overall: \$5.9M under budget
  - Unplanned costs for 3600 Rivers
    - \$1.3M for personnel & operating (from lapse)
    - \$2.5M for capital (from other Facility projects)
  - Plan to utilize remaining savings from FY18 in the FY19 budget
    - Maintain reserves
    - Facility projects

- Additional revenues: \$5.1M
  - Primarily property taxes
- Additional expenditure requests: \$19.0M

Challenge of \$13.9M

- Personnel Request: \$7.6M higher than FY18
- Personnel (in progress): 6.0M higher
  - Continue longevity/merit: \$3.5M
  - Additional retirement cost: \$1.3M
  - -3600 Rivers: \$0.4M
  - New positions: ?

- Operating Request: \$9.4M higher than FY18
- Operating (in progress): \$1.9M higher
  - Inflation: \$2.5M
    - Sheriff contracts
    - Facilities Management contracts
    - Technology Services contracts
  - 3600 Rivers: \$1.5M
  - Facilities maintenance projects: down \$2.0M

- Capital Request: \$2.0M higher than FY18
- Capital (in progress): \$3.1M lower
  - Facilities maintenance projects down

### Summary

- Propose budget without property tax increase
- Facilities maintenance projects deferred
- Continued evaluation of facilities in FY18 and FY19
  - Determine annual amount needed in FY20 and beyond to maintain facilities
  - FY20 may require additional revenues to fund facilities maintenance
