The Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Grant Program is a competitive grant awarded by the South Carolina Office of Attorney General (SCAG) with U.S. Department of Justice funds. The Solicitor's Office has been awarded this grant for the past ten years. This award is therefore a continuation of a previously awarded grant.

The Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Program Grant is a competitive grant awarded by the South Carolina Office of Attorney General (SCAG) with U.S. Department of Justice funds. The Solicitor's Office has been awarded the VOCA grant for the last ten years. In this VOCA application, our office applied to continue 8 full-time advocates to serve both Charleston and Berkeley counties.

ORIGINATING OFFICE PLEASE NOTE:

The Charleston County Coroner's Office is requesting permission to apply for the FY2019 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant Program. The Coroner's Office was awarded funds from the FY2018 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant. This application will be for the continuation, year two, of that same program. This grant program provides funds to improve the quality and timeliness of forensic science and medical examiner/Coroner's office services.

The Coroner's Office is requesting \$54,904.00 to fund a one-year, full-time medicolegal death investigator to assist with the investigation of opioid related deaths as this office has seen a dramatic increase due to the opioid crisis.

The medicolegal death investigator will assist with the increased caseload that is due to an increase in opioid related deaths in Charleston County. This investigator will assist with investigations, laboratory specimen results, documentation and analysis.

The investigator will also assist with the following: implementation and management of a Drug Related Death Review Team to provide risk assessments for preventative and enforcement projects; track toxicology reports and analysis; monitor prescription assessments via the SCRIPTS program; collaborate with narcotic drug taskforces and opioid fatality mapping (DEA); and assist with progressive measures to educate the public, professionals and the community regarding the risk of opioid related deaths.

No match is associated with this request. There is one grant funded FTE associated with this request. The grant period is January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020.

ORIGINATING OFFICE PLEASE NOTE:

During the first and second quarters of 2019, the Economic Development Director worked with High Wire Distilling Co., a Charleston County producer of premium, handcrafted small batch spirits with an agricultural focus, as the company pursued an expansion. The company is committed to using locally sourced products, partnering with area farmers and using 80% of Certified South Carolina Grown grain and fruit in its spirits. Their expansion will involve an investment of \$3M and a creation of 45 jobs. Payroll will be \$2.9M annually (avg. \$65,000/year). (NOTE: Colony Craft Beverage Company, LLC, dba High Wire Distilling Co., has a fee-in-lieu-of-taxes incentive that will receive public hearing at the September 24th County Council meeting and final reading at the October 8th County Council meeting.)

At its September 12th meeting, the S.C. Coordinating Council for Economic Development approved a \$100,000 Set-Aside Grant for Charleston County designed to be passed thru and utilized by High Wire Distilling Co. to offset site prep and building construction costs. The Economic Development Department administers Set-Aside grants and will provide reimbursement to High Wire Distilling Co. for pre-approved expense items upon receipt of proper documentation in the normal fashion.

Submittals were received in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) No. 5389-19C from firms licensed in the State of South Carolina to provide qualifications for the purpose of preparing survey, design engineering and construction engineering and inspection (CE&I) for various roadway, intersection, pedestrian/bikeway, and drainage construction projects to be rendered under the Charleston County Transportation Committee (CTC) program.

Per the terms of the RFQ, it is the intent of the County to identify firms deemed most qualified which will be considered for award of contract not to exceed two years. Delivery Orders for specific projects will be assigned on a rotational basis to best maintain equity in the value of work with exceptions allowed for the following criteria; the nature of the project, the proximity of the firm to the project, the capability of the firm to produce the services in a reasonable time, past performance and the ability to meet the project budget requirements. The County will negotiate a stipulated not to exceed lump sum per phase fee for each Delivery Order for basic services which are estimated not to exceed \$300,000 for the two (2) year term and an individual Delivery Order may not exceed one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000).
