Dorchester School District Two (DD2) has agreed to allow Charleston County (County) to utilize select DD2 school buildings as shelter sites during incidents that render Charleston County shelters unusable. DD2 and the County shall coordinate annually to prepare a shelter plan, which will include agreed upon school buildings to be designated as emergency shelters for Charleston County citizens.

The terms of the agreement include a one-year initial term that will automatically renew annually, no fee to the County, and either Party may terminate the agreement for any reason with 30 days prior written notice to the other Party.

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### **ORIGINATING OFFICE PLEASE NOTE:**

The Charleston County Public Safety Radio Network supports over 7,000 user radios, with over 6,000 in use by area law enforcement, fire and EMS as their primary means to communicate with 9-1-1 Dispatch and on incident scenes. The Radio Network Prime Site, which is located in the equipment shelter at the base of the PSB radio tower, controls and operates the radio network and its 16 radio towers.

The Prime Site has built in backups and redundancies that prevent loss of radio communications should a critical component of the radio network fail. However, all these critical backups are collocated in the same shelter at the base of the PSB radio tower. As of today, there exists no geographically diverse backup to the Prime Site should a catastrophic occurrence render the Prime Site – and the radio network - inoperable.

Motorola has provided Charleston County a proposal to eliminate the risk of a singular Prime Site by installing a second Geo-Redundant Prime Site that would be located at the CDC. Should a catastrophic failure occur at the PSB Prime Site, the Geo-Redundant Prime Site would take over the operation and control of the radio network and provide the continuity of full operation of the Charleston County Public Safety Radio Network.

The Charleston County Public Works Department requested qualifications from all interested consulting engineering firms, licensed in the State of South Carolina, and familiar with performing Construction Engineering & Inspection (CE&I) Services on state and local government department of transportation highway and bridge construction. The services are requested for the Palmetto Commerce Interchange Project near mile marker 206 on I-26 in Charleston County. This is a large scale construction project that includes the construction of a new interchange on I-26 between US-78 and Ashley Phosphate Interchanges. The services may include, but are not limited to, services to perform preconstruction support, construction management, construction engineering, construction survey verification, public relations, and quality acceptance and assurance inspection and testing in the areas of concrete, earthwork, drainage and base, erosion control, traffic control and asphalt roadway to determine compliance with the contract requirements.

Due to the significant amount of preconstruction services remaining to be completed for this project, it is anticipated this contract will be negotiated in two phases with preconstruction support services being the first phase and construction engineering and inspection being the second phase.

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ORIGINATING OFFICE PLEASE NOTE:

In 2005 a five-year lease was executed between Heritage Trust Federal Credit Union (HTFCU or Tenant) and Charleston County (Landlord) for the installation and use of an ATM in the parking lot of the East Cooper Service Center. The lease has been extended since the original term expired in 2010.

The County negotiated to renew the lease for a five-year term with annual CPI increases, however, HTFCU provided documents showing that the transaction volume and profitability of the ATM have been decreasing over the last several years. Since the ATM provides a service to the East Cooper Service Center customers and County citizens, the County agreed to renew for a five-year term at flat rent.

### **ACTION REQUESTED OF COUNCIL**

Approve Department Head recommendation to execute a five-year lease amendment to extend the lease agreement with the Heritage Trust Federal Credit Union, for the drive thru ATM located in the parking lot of the East Cooper Service Center.
