SITUATION

Charleston Center has received its annual contract from the South Carolina Department of Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Services (SC-DAODAS) for Partners in Achieving Independence through Recovery and Self-Sufficiency Strategies (PAIRS). This contract reimburses inpatient bed charges and transitional expenses for Department of Social Services (DSS) clients who receive Temporary Aid to Needy Families (TANF) funds.

This contract is in the amount of \$258,500.00, which are federally appropriated dollars from the US Department of Health and Human Services through and agreement with South Carolina DSS. These funds pay for bed costs for DSS clients as well as approved expenditures to help these DSS clients prepare for employment and independent living, including job preparation training, transportation, childcare services, clothing, and rent assistance. This contractual funding has been in place for several years with the expectation that it will continue.

Mayor Harry V. Herrington, III of the Town of Meggett has requested that the Town Code Enforcement officers be allowed to prosecute their cases in the Charleston County Magistrate's Court.

After approval from Charleston County Legal Department, I see no problems with the Town of Meggett scheduling their code enforcement cases in the Ravenel Magistrate Court as it would simply be one more agency prosecuting in the court just as various other law enforcement agencies do.

All fines paid will remain with the Charleston County Magistrate's Court until surrendered to the Charleston County Treasurer, as required by statute. The Treasurer retains the county portion of the fine and distributes the state assessments.

Statute § 14-25-5© of the South Carolina Code of Laws provides that any municipality may prosecute its cases in the County Magistrate's Court upon approval by the governing body. This this action needs to be submitted to County Council for approval. If approved, we will meet with the appropriate parties to facilitate the process.

SITUATION

The Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation is dedicated to improving the life-saving capabilities of first responders and public safety organizations in communities served by Firehouse Subs by providing funding, resources and support.

According to the American Heart Association, sudden cardiac arrest is a leading cause of death in the United States. Every year, 475,000 people die from cardiac arrest in the United States. Using an AED greatly increases survival rates by up to 60 percent according to OSHA. In many cases it can be the difference between life and death.

SITUATION

The Charleston County Public Safety Radio Network supports over 7,000 user radios, with over 6,000 in use by area law enforcement, fire and EMS as their primary means to communicate with 9-1-1 Dispatch and during incident response. The Radio Network utilizes 16 towers throughout Charleston County, five of which are County owned/operated and eleven of which are leased from other tower owner/operators. Each of these 16 towers provides in building radio coverage in their respective areas, and therefore each are critical to providing reliable public safety communications for our Charleston area first responders.

Council approved either five or ten year initial terms for the nine leased towers shown in the table below, however, the agreement for each tower includes several options that automatically extend the term of the agreement unless the County gives notice to the owner of its intent not to extend. If the County decides not to extend then it must give notice to the owner 60, 120, or 180 days before the expiration depending on the terms of each agreement. If the County does not give notice to the owner then each agreement will automatically renew for the next five year option term. See table for details.

An announcement of vacancies for the James Island PSD Fire District 1% Commission were previously made.

Application for appointment was received from James Yetman. No other applications were received.

The Firemen's Insurance and Inspection Fund (1% Commission) is comprised of 21 members: the County Treasurer and 4 representatives from each of the five fire districts in the County (Awendaw, St. John's, St. Paul's, St. Andrews PSD, and James Island PSD). Members are appointed by the Treasurer upon recommendation of County Council for four year terms. All insurance companies doing business in South Carolina must report to the Department of Insurance the amount of fire insurance premiums written for improvements to all assessed property in each county and is then assessed a 1% tax for the fire insurance premiums written per county. That money is deposited into the 1% Fund and is dispersed to each County Treasurer. The Fund is then distributed to each fire district by the County Treasurer through the Firemen's Insurance & Inspection Fund (1%) Commission. The role of the 1% Commission is to ensure that expenditures from the fund are consistent with state statutes that regulate the fund.

SITUATION

The Town of McClellanville (Town) has requested that the County address flooding issues that have been adversely impacting the roadways and surrounding properties in the vicinity of the McClellanville Library located at 222 Baker Street, McClellanville, TMS 764-14-00-016 (Library).

Charleston County Public Works has engineered a solution to mitigate flooding in the area, which includes constructing a drainage pipe on the Library and other surrounding properties. Public Works will design and construct the pipe, but the Town will be responsible to maintain and repair the drainage pipes. Part of the drainage pipe will be located on the Library's property and the Town has requested an easement from the County to access, maintain, and repair this portion of the pipe. The easement area on the Library property is approximately 20'W x 155'L (3,113 SF / 0.07 acres). See attached easement plat.

The Town requested the project through the County Transportation Committee (CTC) C Fund program. The CTC administers the C Fund for the County and this requested project was approved by the CTC and Council in 2015. The C Fund is funded by the State gas sales tax.

ACTION REQUESTED OF COUNCIL

Approve Department Head recommendation to execute the drainage easement.

Dear Mr. Adams:

The Town of McClellanville would like to request that drainage improvements on Scotia Street be funded under the FY 2016 CTC road improvement program. The Town has requested these improvements since 2010 through both "C" Fund projects and the Charleston County Transportation Sales Tax Program. This project is of vital interest to the Town. In 2014, Roper St. Francis Healthcare System acquired our local physician's practice. The practice is located on Scotia Street, which has a severe problem with flooding and does not have an adequate drainage system to remove standing water. This can lead to both health and safety issues for residents. RSFH has strongly intimated that they may consider closing the practice if the drainage issues do not improve. This would mean that residents of the Town and the surrounding area would have to travel over 20 miles to seek medical care.

Scotia Street is a neighborhood street, approximately .3 mile in length. The Town request underground drainage improvements along the length of the road, from the intersection of Scotia and Pinckney Street to the intersection of Scotia and Morrison Street. While small improvements have been made between 211 Scotia and the Venning Street intersection, the street flooding and drainage problems continue to be an issue for both residents of Scotia Street and patients of the physician practice.

We understand that the acquisition of any necessary easements would be the responsibility of the Town. The Town of McClellanville will also accept responsibility for perpetual maintenance of the project if selected for funding. The number of businesses and home that will be served by the project is

project if selected for funding. The number of businesses and home that will be served by the project is 14. We ask that the CTC Committee take into consideration the affect that losing the physician practice will have on the Town of McClellanville and the surrounding area and make our request a priority.



WHEREAS, public beach and water access, with accessible parking, is an important part of quality of life for the citizens of this State and of Charleston County; **and**

WHEREAS, public beach and water access, subject to reasonable restrictions including social distancing and other safety directives, is an important part of the well-being of all citizens of the State and Charleston County during the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic; **and**

WHEREAS, certain beach communities and municipalities continue to restrict public access to beaches and waters for the citizens of the State and County; **and**

WHEREAS, the County of Charleston has enjoyed mutually beneficial relationships with our many beach communities and respective municipalities; **and**

WHEREAS, Senate Bill S. 40 was prefiled in the South Carolina General Assembly on December 9, 2020 by Senator Larry K. Grooms, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit A; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT CHARLESTON COUNTY COUNCIL does hereby support the passage and adoption of Senate Bill S.40 by the South Carolina General Assembly, which would guarantee reasonable parking access to public beaches and waters, so as to mutually benefit the citizens and businesses of the respective municipalities and beach communities within the State of South Carolina and County of Charleston.
