#### SITUATION

The Charleston County Public Works Department FY20 North Charleston Resurfacing Plan project shall consist of traffic control, surface preparation, asphalt resurfacing, striping, and associated appurtenances of various local paved roadways in North Charleston. The work shall include, but is not limited to, 17,308 tons of asphalt, 9,960 SY of full-depth patching, 42,958 SY of milling, 48,734 LF of permanent pavement markings, 650 SY of pedestrian ramp construction, and 3,170 SY of concrete driveway and sidewalk. The approximate total project length is 12.6 miles. The project will be constructed utilizing the items listed on the bid tab form in the solicitation.

Charleston County entered into an intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with the City of North Charleston to complete pavement management projects. In accordance with the IGA this project will be funded by the City of North Charleston and managed by Charleston County. Once Council has authorized award of the contract, acceptance of funding from the City of North Charleston will be completed.

Bids were received in accordance with the terms and conditions of Invitation for Bid No. 5527-21C. The mandatory Small Business Enterprise (SBE) requirement for this solicitation is 12.2% and the Minority Women Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (MWDBE) goal is 25%.

#### SITUATION

Qualifications were requested from all interested consulting firms, licensed in the State of South Carolina, experienced in providing engineering and environmental permitting services for the Central Park Road Culvert Crossing. The existing culvert crossing is located along Central Park Road on James Island. This area is tidally influenced and the road is subject to overtopping. The scope of the project will be to mitigate the roadway overtopping while also properly designing the crossing given the requirements of the entire drainage basin.

#### SITUATION

The right of way acquisition process is the most unpredictable portion of a Transportation Sales Tax Project schedule. A negotiated purchase of right of way depends on the willingness of affected property owners to reach a mutually agreeable settlement. Therefore, the entire schedule can be negatively impacted when the attempted acquisition of one or more individual properties cannot be resolved through reasonable negotiations.

In order to move forward with construction of the Palmetto Commerce Interchange, which consists of a new interchange along I-26 between US 78 (University Boulevard) and Ashley Phosphate Road, staff requests that Council approve the use of eminent domain. It is intended that the actual condemnation actions would be filed only in cases where it appears that a settlement is not imminent.

Staff remains extremely sensitive to the rights of the property owners affected by this project, and has directed that the right of way consultants continue to exercise all due care when negotiating with the owners. It is staff's intent to continue coordination with the property owners during the condemnation process in an effort to reach settlements out of court.

#### A RESOLUTION

#### AUTHORIZING THE EXERCISE OF EMINENT DOMAIN TO ACQUIRE TITLE TO OR INTERESTS IN REAL PROPERTY FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING ROAD IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE PALMETTO COMMERCE INTERCHANGE

#### **SECTION I. FINDINGS**

THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CHARLESTON COUNTY, IN MEETING DULY ASSEMBLED, HEREBY FINDS AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, as a project being undertaken as part of its Transportation Sales Tax Program, Charleston County intends to construct Palmetto Commerce Interchange in North Charleston in Charleston County, SC (the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the plans for the improvements are shown on the technical drawings entitled "Construction Plans" (the "Plans"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Plans depict, *inter alia*, the existing roadway, the proposed roadway and the privately-owned properties and portions of properties that the County seeks to acquire to complete the Project; and

**WHEREAS**, said Plans are subject to refinement and revision as additional design efforts and investigations are undertaken regarding the roadway alignment and the Project's components, including but not limited to sidewalks, utilities, drainage facilities and the traveling surface; and

**WHEREAS**, the acquisition of the privately-owned properties will be accomplished in accordance with the eminent domain laws of the State of South Carolina; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the citizens of Charleston County to acquire title to or an interest in the privately-owned properties in order to complete the Project; and

**W**HEREAS, public purposes, health, welfare, and safety, including, but not limited to, the facilitation of commerce and the convenience of the traveling public will be served by acquiring the properties and completing the Project; and

**WHEREAS**, the properties acquired will be for a public use, including but not limited to, the improvement of a publicly-owned thoroughfare in Charleston County.

#### SECTION II. ACTIONS AUTHORIZED

As a result of the findings set forth above, and by virtue of the powers granted to the County under the constitution and statutes of the State of South Carolina, the Charleston County Council hereby authorizes and directs the following:

Charleston County Council hereby authorizes the exercise of eminent domain to acquire full title or a property interest in the privately-owned property as shown on the above-described Plans, as the same may be refined or revised from time to time, for the Project. Council expressly authorizes the acquisition of the parcels identified on the above-described Plans, in whole or in part, as the needs of the Project so require.

#### **SITUATION**

The U.S. Department of the Treasury is providing \$12,441,902.30 to Charleston County for an Emergency Rental Assistance program to assist households that are unable to pay rent and utilities due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Charleston County must use the funds to provide assistance to eligible households through existing or newly created rental assistance programs.

The Community Development department staff will manage and provide oversight for the funding and partner with local non-profit organizations to administer the program. Ten percent of the funds are available for housing stability services, including case management and other services intended to keep households stably housed, and administrative costs. Not less than 90 percent of awarded funds must be used for direct financial assistance, including rent, rental arrears, utilities and home energy costs, utilities and home energy costs arrears, and other expenses related to housing.

Staff will create a program to manage the emergency assistance program to include the following:

- Purchasing an integrated software program to administer the program.
- Ensuring that priority is given to the unemployed and individuals at or below 50% AMI, as required by the funding.
- Partnering with qualified local non-profit organizations to help administer the program and provide outreach and case management to eligible households.
- All expenses will be covered by the award, to include; temporary staff, equipment and supplies.

#### SITUATION

The Cell 5 Liner at the Bees Ferry Landfill was initially designed and permitted by HDR, Inc. When construction bids came in over budget, S2L Incorporated (S2Li) was selected and tasked by former County Attorney, Joe Dawson, and the County's Environmental Management consultant, Kessler Consulting, to value engineer the Cell 5 Liner Design and bid the project for construction. They also wanted S2Li to redesign the convenience center and household hazardous waste (HHW) site located at the Bees Ferry Landfill.

S2Li is an engineering consulting firm based out of Florida with extensive experience and specialization solely on solid waste projects. In April 2020, Charleston County entered into Contract 5471 with S2Li for design and bidding services of the Cell 5 Liner. The construction contract was bid out and awarded to Southard Brothers Construction in November 2020. The 140-day construction duration for Cell 5 is critical due to the limited airspace remaining in Cell 4 of the landfill. There are severe cost ramifications to the County if Cell 5 is not completed before Cell 4 runs out of capacity. The construction Notice to Proceed was issued on November 30, 2020 and the contractor is actively constructing the project.

Due to the critical schedule and strict compliance requirements, Environmental Management engaged S2Li to perform the construction engineering and inspection services as the engineer of record on the project. S2Li is currently providing these services and has also been in direct communication with SCDHEC with regard to the landfill construction permit and the compliance requirements. A Sole Source/Non-Competitive Procurement was executed in the amount of \$238,057 for S2Li to provide preliminary project management prior to construction and the engineering and inspection services during construction. The Non-competitive procurement did not include the cost for the Construction Quality Assurance (CQA) Report and construction closeout certification.

While S2Li is on-site for construction oversight of Cell 5, it would be cost-effective and provide more seamless integration of work activities to continue utilizing S2Li's services for the design and permitting of the Bees Ferry convenience center and HHW site. The current layout and traffic control of the site is insufficient and a safety concern as residents are forced to intermingle with the County's heavy equipment servicing the site. The proposed redesign would eliminate this concern.

Authorize staff to work with Procurement to amend S2Li's current contract 5471 to include the necessary engineering consulting services to complete Cell 5 construction and the convenience center redesign at the Bees Ferry Landfill.
