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Situation:

On June 6th 2023, Leidos, a Fortune 500 science and technology leader, announced plans to establish new South Carolina operations in Charleston County, at Ladson Industrial Park in North Charleston. The company's \$17 million investment will create up to 150 new jobs over the next five years. The new facility will be a Manufacturing Center of Excellence catering to Leidos' Security Enterprise Solutions (SES) operation. The center will specialize in the production of top-of-the-line security systems for screening checked baggage, cargo, and passengers.

At their September 7, 2023, meeting, the S.C. Coordinating Council for Economic Development approved a \$400,000 Set-Aside grant for Charleston County, designed to be passed thru and utilized by the company to offset building improvement costs made to their Charleston County facility.

The Economic Development Department administers Set-Aside grants and will provide reimbursement for pre-approved expense items upon receipt of proper documentation.

Department Head Recommendation:

Authorize the formal acceptance of a \$400,000 Set-Aside grant awarded from the S.C. Coordinating Council for Economic Development for utilization by Leidos to offset a portion of the building improvement costs made to their Charleston County facility. 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Situation:

On September 12, 2023 the Charleston County Transportation Committee (CCTC) funded the FY 2024 "C" Fund Road Improvement Program.

As has been the practice for many years, County staff administers the funds, engineering design, contracts, and performs construction management services for the CCTC. County managed CTC project costs are reimbursed from funds appropriated for the projects. The CCTC has allocated \$5,663,135.50 for resurfacing various State, County, and Municipal roads and an additional \$4,707,662 for construction of the projects listed in the attached spread sheet titled "Charleston CTC FY 2024 Recommended Project Funding". Other construction projects, not listed on the attached sheet, may be selected at the discretion of the CCTC at a later date should additional funds become available.

"C" Funds are derived from state gasoline user fee which is deposited in the County Transportation Fund to be allocated to all counties within the state. "C" Funds are apportioned to each County in the following manner:

 One-third based on the ratio of the land area of the county to the land area of the state
One-third based on the ratio of county population to state population as determined by the latest ten-year census, and

3. One-third based on the ratio of rural road mileage in the county to rural road mileage in the state.

Situation:

The Sheriff's Office is requesting a non-competitive procurement for the replacement purchase of a helicopter and the compatible law enforcement equipment not to exceed \$7,000,000.00 from various vendors.

The Sheriff's Office requests the purchase of the purchase a 2024 Bell 407GXI Aircraft Helicopter from Bell Texton to replace the 2012 Bell 407GX, which was destroyed on August 1, 2023, during an emergency landing caused by mechanical failure. The County has filed an insurance claim to be compensated for the lost helicopter, however it is a lengthy process that can exceed one year.

The 2024 Bell 407GXI being sold by Bell Texton, has a 14-month lead time to be built and requires an initial 15% down payment towards the purchasing price. The helicopter is critical to the daily operations of the department as it is used to enhance the effectiveness, efficiency, and the ability to monitor and respond to various situations. These situations include Search Operations, Emergency Response, Disaster Response, Public Safety, Pursuit Assistance, Crowd Control, Arial Surveillance, Photography and Mapping, and Community Engagement. Bell Texton is including a warranty of 3 years or 1,000 flight hours. The helicopter should not require any major maintenance within the first five years.

The law enforcement equipment necessary for helicopter would be purchased from three vendors to avoid a potential 20% competitor markup price. Therefore, the Sheriff's Office is requesting authorization for a non-competitive procurement.

Department Head Recommendation:

• Authorize staff to enter into contract with Bell Texton for the 2024 Bell 407GXI Aircraft Helicopter with an initial 15% down-payment,

• Authorize staff to purchase law enforcement equipment, warranty, and installation plans for the helicopter from various vendors.

• Appropriate up to \$7,000,000 for the purchase of a helicopter to be reimbursed from a future bond issue. Amount borrowed will be reduced by any proceeds (including insurance) from the disposal of the old helicopter.

Situation:

The two proposed demonstration projects would address the documented unmet needs of the County's homeless population while increasing capacity within the local network of nonprofit service providers and landlords, both priorities identified by County Council as priorities under the Economic Stability For All category in the American Rescue Plan Act Funding.

The first of these opportunities is the Just Home Project. On March 22, 2023, County Council approved accepting grant funds from the MacArthur Foundation for the Just Home Project (JHP) in March 2022. The JHP aims to provide comprehensive and innovative solutions to address homelessness at the crossroads of recidivism and foster sustainable pathways to housing through support services for vulnerable, nonviolent repeat offenders as identified by the Charleston County Criminal Justice Coordinating Council's "Most Visible People" Program.

After thoroughly considering specifically the operational budget for the future implementation partner for the Just Home Project, opportunities have been identified for Charleston County to support the project's success by recommending ARPA funding. The County's investment of ARPA funds would support the operational needs of the future implementation partner and strengthen the capacity of the partner to service the target population. The recommended funding would support costs associated with comprehensive wrap-around services, including on and off-site healthcare and employment assistance, social services navigation, legal services,

transportation, transitional housing, communication and technology access, and rental assistance for participants transitioning to permanent housing.

Staff recommends that \$204,428.00 of ARPA funding be committed to the Just Home Project, bringing the total operational budget for the implementation partner to \$500,000.00 to be expended throughout the demonstration phase (12-18 months).

The second opportunity to address the needs of those facing housing insecurity in the community is the Low Barrier Housing Collective (LBHC) project, also known as the Rental Collective (RC) project. The LBHC project model has been applied successfully in Nashville, Phoenix, and Orange County, with a launch in the City of Charleston this month. The LBHC aims to uniquely address the challenge of homelessness and increase the capacity of service providers in the community by bringing nonprofit agencies and property owners across the community together with a focus on improving the accessibility of rental housing units by those with increased obstacles to housing. This demonstration project seeks to reduce barriers by creating financial incentives for property owners to lower specific qualifications for renters, including but not limited to rental and credit history and criminal record. These incentives ensure the needs of the property owners are being met and bring them in as crucial stakeholders in collaboration to address the housing crisis.

The project's recommended funding would support the anticipated staffing costs, equipment, consultation, marketing, and early implementation/ development of necessary components to begin adding housing inventory into the system. The City of Charleston has committed \$200,000 to the project to support rental assistance, and staff recommends that Council consider matching this commitment to facilitate the foundational phase of the demonstration project.

Situation:

The 2016 Sales Tax Referendum included a sidewalk infill project on Folly Road as one of the four requested James Island Improvement projects to be funded. The purpose of the planned project is to improve the safety and access for pedestrians along the Folly Road corridor while minimizing the impacts to private property and businesses. During the development of the project, the Rethink Folly Plan recommended further pedestrian enhancements such as a multi-use path and bike lanes as opposed to the sidewalk-only project originally intended. On October 11, 2017, Council approved the submission of a revised Folly Road Improvements Complete Streets application that would be consistent with this recommendation and included an expansion of the project scope, with the corresponding increase for the matching funds being sourced from the Town of James Island, Charleston County, and the City of Charleston. Staff recommends authorization for the acceptance of those matching funds from the Town of James Island and the City of Charleston in the amount of \$400,000 from each municipality.

As we look to conclude the right-of-way acquisition phase of the project and move forward to construction, Staff requests that Council approve the use of eminent domain. Of the 51 total tracts that we need right- of-way or permissions from, six properties will require the use of eminent domain because either the owner is opposed to the project or is nonresponsive to several attempts at contact. All of the aforementioned tracts are businesses, commercial/retail, or vacant/undeveloped. The proposed land acquisitions will minimally impact each parcel and comprise only of frontage areas of the property. No structures will be taken or impacted with these acquisitions. It is still staff's intent to continue coordination with the property owners during the condemnation process in an effort to reach settlements out of court.

SECTION I. FINDINGS

THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CHARLESTON COUNTY, IN MEETING DULY ASSEMBLED, HEREBY FINDS AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, as a project being undertaken as part of its Transportation Sales Tax Program, Charleston County intends to construct certain improvements to the Folly Road corridor from the Ellis Creek Bridge to Wilton Street on James Island in Charleston County, SC (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the plans for the improvements will be shown on the technical drawings entitled "Construction Plans" (the "Plans"); and

WHEREAS, the Plans will depict, *inter alia*, the existing roadway, the proposed roadway and the privately-owned properties and portions of properties that the County seeks to acquire to complete the Project; and

WHEREAS, said Plans are subject to refinement and revision as additional design efforts and investigations are undertaken regarding the roadway alignment and the Project's components, including but not limited to sidewalks, utilities, drainage facilities and the traveling surface; and

WHEREAS, the acquisition of the privately-owned properties will be accomplished in accordance with the eminent domain laws of the State of South Carolina; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the citizens of Charleston County to acquire title to or an interest in the privately-owned properties in order to complete the Project; and




WHEREAS, the properties acquired will be for a public use, including but not limited to, the improvement of a publicly-owned thoroughfare in Charleston County.


SECTION II. ACTIONS AUTHORIZED


