### A RESOLUTION OF CHARLESTON COUNTY COUNCIL

Commemorating the 80th Anniversary of D-Day

**WHEREAS**, on June 6, 1944, D-Day, more than 130,000 American and Allied troops stormed the beaches of Normandy, France, and thousands more parachuted in behind enemy lines, on a mission to retake Europe from the control of Nazi Germany; **and**,

**WHEREAS**, on the night before the attack, General Dwight D. Eisenhower issued a message to the Allied Forces stating, "The eyes of the world are upon you. The hopes and prayers of liberty-loving people everywhere march with you . . . We will accept nothing less than full victory."; **and**,

#### Situation

In January, Charleston County Parks and Recreation Commission ("CCPRC") notified the County of their recent purchase of two lots to expand parking for the Shem Creek boat landing and their intent to apply for a zoning change of the two new parcels as well as the five parcels owned by Charleston County. In a letter received on April 29, 2024 CCPRC requests authorization to include the five parcels owned by Charleston County government in the rezoning request. This will allow all parking associated with the landing to become a conforming use under the Town's ordinances. To plan and implement an on-site parking expansion, the Town of Mount Pleasant requests rezoning all parcels associated with the boat landing parking from residential to public institutions. The Town's planning staff has requested this zoning change from residential zoning to public-institutional to allow all parking associated with the landing to become a conforming use under the Town's ordinances. Public parking lots are a non-confirming use within the Residential zoning.

#### Situation:

The Charleston County Consolidated Emergency Communications Center seeks approval and acceptance of grant funding for the project entitled "Charleston County Targeted Violence and Terrorism Prevention Partnership Program," for which we are requesting \$523,602.77 from the Department of Homeland Security through the FY 2024 Targeted Violence and Terrorism Prevention Grant Program (TVTP).

Charleston County Consolidated Emergency Communications Center, along with its public safety and mental health partners, has identified the need to improve training and resources dedicated to building and/or strengthening its Local Prevention Framework through the identification, assessment, and management of behavioral health patients with the propensity to violence. Additionally, the need to establish a county-wide threat management team has been identified.

This funding will improve the County's Local Prevention Framework by focusing on expanding existing foundational training on the topics of risk awareness, risk assessment, advanced threat management, and legal implications for multidisciplinary threat management teams. Grant funding will also be utilized to establish a multidisciplinary Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management (BTAM) team for the purpose of information sharing across agencies and case management for individuals of concern for engaging in acts of violence in Charleston County. To facilitate information sharing and case management capabilities, grant funding will also be

utilized to procure a comprehensive case management software solution. An FTE for a Program Manager to oversee the Charleston County Targeted Violence and Terrorism Prevention Partnership Program will be fully funded by this grant for the two years of the TVTP grant's period of performance. This FTE is grant-contingent, and will not be absorbed by any of the partnering County departments should grant funding be removed.

The Consolidated Emergency Communications Center will coordinate the overall grant project, facilitate coordination and cooperation between partner agencies, and ensure grant objectives are met.

The period of performance for this grant is from 10/1/2024 through 9/30/2026.

#### **Department Head Recommendation:**

Apply for, and accept if awarded, the Targeted Violence and Terrorism Prevention Grant provided through the Department of Homeland Security in the amount of \$523,602.77 with the understanding that:

#### Situation:

Project A, B, and C as outlined below are intended to be awarded. The Trenchless Pipe Repairs – Woodside, Heaton Place, and Plymouth Avenue project will be constructed utilizing the items listed on the bid tab form in the solicitation.

## Project A-Heaton Place Subdivision CIPP

This project is located in the Heaton Place subdivision in Charleston County off Highway 78 and consist of repairing 698 feet of Corrugated Metal Pipe (CMP) using Cured-In-Place-Pipe (CIPP). The purpose of this work and repairs will be to install 698 feet of CIPP in rear and side yards of homes between Hallsford Drive and Levenshall Drive in Heaton Place subdivision. The CIPP repairs located under roadway and within residential yards are to prevent the CMP from collapsing in on itself and posing potential safety hazards to residents within the neighborhood. The purpose of this work and repairs will be to install 593 feet of CIPP throughout Woodside subdivision at three primary locations. The CIPP repairs located under roadway and grassed areas are to prevent the CMP from collapsing in on itself and posing potential safety hazards to residents within the neighborhood. This work may include accessing between residential

homes through Public drainage easements, pipe cleaning, inspection, and dewatering. Charleston County Public Works cleaned all pipes by vactor truck in early July 2023. Project B is 1.6 miles driving distance from Project A.

## Project C-Plymouth Avenue CIPP

This project is located along the east side of and parallel to Plymouth Avenue between the Lakeshore Drive and Frampton Avenue intersection on James Island and consist of repairing 361 feet of Reinforced Concrete Pipe (RCP) using Cured-In-Place-Pipe (CIPP). The purpose of this work and repairs will be to install 361 feet of CIPP in the Plymouth Avenue right-of-way. 


