Charleston County Hosts 2011 Earth Day Festival on April 16

11 a.m. - 3 p.m. at Park Circle in North Charleston

<u>Charleston County's Environmental Management Department</u> will host the <u>2011 Earth Day Festival</u> on Saturday, April 16, from 11 a.m. - 3 p.m. at Park Circle in North Charleston.

The County's 12th annual Earth Day Festival is a celebration of Charleston County's environmental community. The festival provides educational opportunities highlighting Charleston County's environmental programs in an entertaining atmosphere.

"The Earth Day Festival is a very important event for us," said Mike Kenerley, Charleston County's Environmental Management Recycling Programs Manager. "We are very excited about this opportunity to increase environmental awareness in our community with fun, family-oriented activities."

Charleston County's Earth Day Festival has attracted as many as 8,000 people to the free event each year. All participants are asked to commit to reducing waste. New this year will be several Resource Recycling Centers located throughout the park for recycling and composting waste generated at the event.

Charleston County's <u>Earth Day Art Contest</u> was held again this year. Students in grades kindergarten through sixth grade were asked to submit drawings on Earth Day subjects with the theme of "Do Your Part, Be Earth Smart." The winning artwork will be the theme of the festival and will be printed on the back of the volunteers' T-shirts, which are manufactured from recycled cotton. A Poetry Contest was also held for students in grades seven through 12, and the winner will have the opportunity to read his/her poem at the festival.
