Spruill Avenue Bike Lane/Resurfacing Project Starts Oct. 16

First phase includes temporary lane closures and traffic shifts lasting two to three weeks

<u>Charleston County Government</u> announces that construction will begin on the Spruill Avenue Bike Lane and Resurfacing Project on Tuesday, Oct. 16.

Details on the first phase of construction:

- Drivers should expect to navigate through temporary lane closures and traffic shifts as construction crews work in the area.
- The first phase of the project will be ongoing for approximately two to three weeks.
- The work will occur between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. to minimize the impact on the surrounding neighborhoods.
- Construction will begin with the repair of sidewalk, curb and gutter, and concrete driveways.
- All construction areas will be marked with construction cones and signs.

Overall project details:

- The road will be resurfaced, and bike lanes will be installed along Spruill Avenue from Meeting Street to E. Montague Avenue.
- The number of traffic lanes will be permanently reduced to allow for the bike lane installation.

- The entire project is expected to be completed in approximately 60 days.

The goal of the project, which is funded by <u>Charleston County Transportation Committee</u>, is to resurface Spruill Avenue and install dedicated bike lanes. The bike lanes will provide another segment of bike lanes connecting the City of North Charleston and the City of Charleston.
