Traffic Alert: Speed limit reduced to 35 mph in area of Harbor View Road and Nighttime Closures Update

<u>Charleston County Government</u> alerts drivers that the speed limit along the construction area of Harbor View Road, between Fort Johnson Road and North Shore Drive, has been reduced to 35 mph as part of the <u>Harbor View Road Improvement project</u>. Also, the nighttime lane closures will continue through Oct. 31, 2014.

Harbor View Road Reduction in Speed Limit to 35 mph:

- Drivers should be aware that the speed limit has been reduced to 35 mph in the construction area of Harbor View Road due to ongoing construction.
- The reduced speed limit applies to the entire construction area of Harbor View Road, from Fort Johnson Road to North Shore Drive.
- Reduce speed limit signs have been installed and will be in effect for the entire duration of the project, which is expected to be completed in September 2016.

Nighttime closures on Harbor View Road, Oct. 17-Oct. 31

- Nighttime lane closures will occur on Harbor View Road between James Island Creek and Fort Johnson Road.
- The work will occur between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m.
- Flagmen will be on site to control traffic.
- At no time will the entire roadway be blocked to traffic.
- Drivers will have access to businesses and residential properties along Harbor View Road at all times.
- At least one lane will remain open to traffic under flagging operations.
- Drivers traveling through the project's construction zone are asked to be aware of equipment and crews working in the area at all times.

The purpose of the Harbor View Road Improvements project is to improve traffic flow and safety on Harbor View Road and to provide adequate bicycle and pedestrian facilities. The scheduled completion of the project is expected in September 2016.

The project will include the addition of a center two-way left turn lane between North Shore Drive and Affirmation Boulevard, the addition of right turn lanes at major intersections, the addition of traffic signals at Fort Sumter Drive and Mikell Drive, the construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Harbor View Road and Fort Johnson Road and the addition of pedestrian and bicycle facilities

The construction will cover 2.1 miles of Harbor View Road and the project is expected to take two years to complete.
